PROSPECTUS

Session 1974/75

THE HIGH SCHOOL OF DUNDEE consists of two Schools—a Boys' School and a Girls' School—and provides a complete course of primary and secondary education for both boys and girls. The Boys' School has a Cadet Corps and a Rifle Club, and the Girls' School a Company of Girl Guides and a Brownie Pack. There is a School Literary Society, a School Magazine and a School Library. The School is inspected by the Scottish Education Department.

Subscribers

Six Members of the Board of Directors are elected by Subscribers. Any person can become a Subscriber with full rights to participate in such election by subscribing a minimum of Five Pounds to the Governing Body. This sum should be paid to the Bursar and earmarked for the Reconstruction and Building Fund.

School Hours

The School Hours extend, in the case of Class L.I, from 9 a.m. to 12.45 p.m.; in L.II to L.VI from 9 a.m. to 3.10 p.m.; in the other Classes from 9 a.m. to 3.55 p.m.

An Interval of One Hour is allowed for luncheon; Juniors 12.5 p.m. to 1.5 p.m., Seniors 12.45 p.m. to 1.45 p.m.

ORGANISATION

THE PREPARATORY DEPARTMENT

Classes L.I — L.III

THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

Classes L.IV — L.VII

The curriculum consists of Religious Instruction, English, Junior Mathematics, History, Geography, Art, Singing, Gymnastics, Junior Science, Handwork, and, for girls, Sewing.

THE SENIOR SCHOOL

Religious Instruction, Art, Singing, Gymnastics and Games are part of the syllabus throughout the Senior School. All girls in Forms I-III are taught Homecraft.

1. Forms I-II

The course of instruction beginning in Form I leads to the Scottish Certificate of Education (Ordinary Grade) in Form IV, the Scottish Certificate of Education (Higher Grade) in Form V, Certificate of Sixth Year Studies, University Entrance, and the Professions.

The syllabus in Form I common to all pupils consists of :— English, History, Geography, French or Spanish, Classical Studies, Mathematics, Science, with Art, Technical Subjects (for boys), Homecraft (for girls).

In Form II certain pupils will be chosen to continue the more formal study of Latin, the basis of selection being their performance in the relevant subjects in Form I.

2. Forms III-VI

Entry to this part of the Senior School and choice of subjects in it are determined by the Class Examinations held in Form II in December and May.

In Form III, specialist courses in Music, Art, Modern Studies, Anatomy and Physiology, Economics and Secretarial Studies may be begun. At this stage it is also possible for pupils to discontinue Science and substitute Greek or German.

Changes of curriculum in Form V, where necessary, are determined at the beginning of Session by the results of the Ordinary Grade Examination. Courses in French, Spanish, German, Russian, Italian and Biology for specialist pupils may be begun at this stage after consultation with the Rector. Such courses can lead to presentation at O Level in Form V and H Level in Form VI.

Special Subjects. In addition to the ordinary subjects of the curriculum, instruction is given in Pianoforte, Orchestral Instruments, Singing and Voice Production, Speech and Drama and Dancing.

Reports. A Report of the progress of each pupil is sent to Parents or Guardians twice a year; a third special Report is sent where a pupil's work or conduct is unsatisfactory.

Entry

1. Application for entry to Class L.I should be made well in advance of the age of 5, as there is always a long waiting list.

2. Entry to the senior School is by an examination held in March, and by interviews which take place during April.

3. When vacancies occur elsewhere, examinations are held for the purpose.

SCHOOL RULES

The attention of Parents and Pupils is specially directed to the following rules; adherence to these is a necessary condition of attendance at School :—

1. **Appearance.** All pupils must wear the School Uniform. School Uniform should be worn at ALL School events, Debates, Saturday Games, Athletics Meetings, etc.

Pupils are required to be at all times tidy in their appearance. This includes neatness of hair style.

All clothing, books, etc. must be marked with the owner's name.

2. **Absence.** All requests for leave of absence must be made by note or telephone call to the Rector (or Deputy Rector) and Miss Gray at least two days in advance. Parents are particularly requested not to ask for extensions of holidays, e.g. at week-ends, unless in very exceptional circumstances.

When pupils have been absent from any class, they must, on their return, bring to Mr Paton or Miss Gray a note of explanation from their parents or guardians.

When a pupil is absent for more than a week the Rector or Miss Gray should be contacted by telephone or letter.

Pupils must not leave School during the day without permission from the Rector, Deputy Rector or Miss Gray, or, in an emergency, from one of the teaching staff.

3. **Health.** The Rector requests that when a pupil has some long-standing health difficulty or weakness he should be kept informed, in order that members of staff may know how to act in an emergency.

In order to minimise the spread of infection, parents are requested to refrain from sending their children to school while still suffering from what may be considered minor ailments, e.g. colds, sore throats.

Sometimes pupils have an accident while at school or they may become ill enough for us to require to be in contact with the parents. If both parents are normally out of the house at the same time, will they please see that School has an 'emergency' number or some address to contact.

All pupils are medically inspected periodically. When infectious disease is found to exist in a family, the Rector must be informed immediately, and the members of the family can be admitted to school only on producing a Medical Certificate.

4. Discipline. The Rector exercises the right of removing from the School any pupil whose attitude to work or discipline is unsatisfactory. Pupils whose work is unsatisfactory may be retained in School after hours to do extra work.

5. Smoking. Parents are invited to co-operate with the School in discouraging the habit of smoking altogether. But within the School's jurisdiction smoking and the carrying of cigarettes are forbidden : this includes the School precincts, the playing-fields, public conveyances going to and from School, the periods of the morning break and the lunch hour wherever the pupils may be, and at all times when the pupils are wearing School Uniform.

6. Money and Valuables. Pupils are forbidden to leave money or valuables in the cloakroom. Parents should ensure that no unnecessary money or valuables are brought to School at all. Where in exceptional cases money must be brought to School, it should be deposited before 9.00 a.m. with Miss Gray (Girls) or with Mr Paton (Boys).

7. Security and Insurance. While every care is taken of articles belonging to pupils while in the School buildings, the Directors can accept no liability in cases of loss or damage. Any question of insurance is the responsibility of parents themselves, as the Board has no insurable interest.

8. Interviews. The Rector, Mr Paton and Miss Gray invite parents to meet them by appointment to discuss any problems affecting their children. Parents who wish consultation about their children's progress in the Preparatory or Junior Departments must make appointments with Miss Knight or Miss Lawson through the Rector. Parents must not contact individual teachers directly. The School telephone numbers are 22465 and 22795. The postal code is DD1 1HU.

9. Preparation of Lessons. Parents are urged to co-operate with the School by making time and quietness at home available for their children.

Note :—All children of Ministers of Religion will be charged two-thirds of the above fees.

Quarter Days — August 28, November 11, January 24, April 11.

All fees payable quarterly in advance, and payment is to be made at the Bursar's Office, 49 Meadowside, Dundee. In the case of new enrolments in Class L.I of the Preparatory Department, the fee for the first quarter must be paid on acceptance of a vacancy, the fee not to be repayable in the case of subsequent withdrawal.

Notice of the withdrawal of a pupil during the Session must be given in writing to the Rector *not later than one calendar month before the end of a quarter*. Where parents know for certain earlier that their children will be leaving, it is a great convenience to the Rector if he knows. Pupils not intending to return to School at the beginning of a Session must give notice to that effect not later than the previous 1st of June, but this does not apply to those in Forms V and VI. An additional quarter's fees must be paid if the requisite notice of withdrawal has not been given.

Pupils entering the School for the first time in the course of a quarter will be charged at the rate of one-seventh of a quarter's fee in respect of every week or part thereof from the date of entry to the end of the quarter.

If a quarter is entered upon, the fees for the whole quarter must be paid.

No rebate will normally be granted in respect of the absence of a pupil on account of sickness or other cause, but in the event of a prolonged absence on account of sickness or accident the Directors reserve the right to remit a proportion of the fees.

When more than three pupils attend from any one family, every pupil after the third is charged only half the inclusive fee, with the exception of those covered by the note above.

The Directors reserve the right to alter the foregoing regulations during the Session and to vary the fees for all or any of the Classes on giving one month's notice prior to any quarter day.

SPECIAL FEES AND CHARGES

A. LUNCHEON

Lunches are served daily in the School dining-hall. The charge is added to the quarterly fee account and once a quarter has been entered upon the charge for the whole quarter must be paid. Adjustments in respect of five or more consecutive absences recorded in the school register will be made in the following quarter's fee account. These will be the only grounds for remission of luncheon charges. Notice of withdrawal of a pupil from lunches during the session must be given to the Bursar by letter not later than one calendar month before the end of a quarter. An additional quarter's charge must be paid if the requisite notice of withdrawal has not been given.

The School also operates a Cafeteria which serves light snacks at the lunch interval and cakes, biscuits, confectionery, etc. at the forenoon break.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE DIRECTORS OF THE HIGH SCHOOL

High School of Dundee.
June, 1974.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

During the last week of the session members of the Board of Directors met a large proportion of the parents to consider the present and future position of this great school. Everyone, I am sure, found the meetings useful. Now it is my duty to give you a picture of the school as I see it over the last session — apart from the financial aspects it is a cheerful one.

The demand for education of the type we offer is stronger than ever. There is a total of 300 children on our waiting lists for vacancies at various stages of the Preparatory and Junior Departments: and we have already far more names on our books for entry to the Preparatory Department in 1975 and 1976 than we have places for. This year at the 12 year-old entry stage we had to turn away more children than we have ever done before — something between one-third and one-half of the total demand. The size of the classes in the Junior School is slowly being reduced by the process of natural wastage. Meantime the smaller intake at the L.I stage over the last three years is beginning to affect the whole Junior School.

But, as I warned last year, this means less income for the school and with inflation galloping on, must in turn result in higher fees. In the light of this week's news about Grant-Aided schools, parents will be ill-advised to expect good news from the Finance Convener when he writes to them next week.

The School, happily, despite quite a few changes, should commence the new session fully staffed. We lose the following teachers: Mrs Ross and Mr Hendry from the Junior Department, Miss Birrell from the English Department, Mrs McDonald from History, Mr McIntosh from Economics, Mr Wilson from Classics, Mrs Pinnock from Modern Languages, Miss Dobson and Miss Duncan from Physical Education and Mrs Craig from Home Economics. These ladies and gentlemen have given valuable service to the school. Three of the married ladies leave to have babies. Messrs J. and G. McIntosh both go to posts of responsibility as does Mr Wilson. Mr G. McIntosh leaves a permanent record of a three-year project — a tannoy system fitted up by him and senior boys which enables the Rector to broadcast to every room in the school. Sadly, however, I have to record the sudden death of Mr David Elder, for many years a part-time teacher of instrumental music in school. It was

indeed tragic that he did not live to see his wife Mrs Elder of our permanent music staff have presented to her the M.B.E. which Her Majesty bestowed on her, and which she so richly earned.

The School is living through difficult times, apart from the political threat. I am constantly heartened by the devotion and loyalty of the Staff. Decision making is a lonely business : but I can always rely on honest and objective advice from them. They know that despite the multifarious activities of the school — the centre and mainspring of it all is the academic progress of the children. Over 95% of all our children go on to University, College, or other form of further education. Here the loyalty of the Staff in the day to day work of the classroom is paramount. In the highest reaches of the School, this session has been outstandingly successful. Six pupils gained entry to Oxford Colleges and one of them, Ross Macdonald, won a Scholarship in History to Balliol. One of them, our Head Girl, Sarah Boase, is the first ever girl to go to Oxford from School and, likewise Pamela Swanney is the first girl to go from us direct to Cambridge. We congratulate both girls on breaking that age-old barrier. We also gained a first place in the Maths/ Science Sector of the Edinburgh Open, the first place in the Glasgow Open, a very good bursary in the St. Andrews Open, the highest place in the Dundee Open and a place in the Aberdeen Open. In this context it is sad that Edinburgh Competition now ceases and a very long honourable Dundee High School tradition is over. At least we maintained our standard to the end. Elsewhere academic standards have been well maintained. I am particularly concerned that all our pupils in the Junior School should be thoroughly trained in sound habits of study as well as gaining mastery of the basic tools of their trade. This aim is being achieved to a very high degree : without it, the superstructure we strive to build in the Senior School would be a flimsy thing indeed. In the Secondary Department, the experiment of having Classical Studies for all in Form I has proved a great success. Fortunately, we are now able to provide, through the Economics Department, more alternatives in courses, though I am still unhappy about the limitations in the Homecraft Department due to lack of space etc. This must be a priority in any future expansion.

Academic standards are always difficult to gauge. But one method is always interesting — comparison with other schools. An analysis for example of the S.C.E. 1973 Higher results shows that our percentage of passes in all the major subjects was anything from 10% to 20% better than the national average. While the percentage of passes at 'A' Grade — perhaps

a truer test of the quality of our academic work at the highest level — was consistently two times and sometimes nearly three times greater than the national averages. At the highest level again our University Bursary results show that D.H.S. pupils and D.H.S. teachers can take their places alongside the best in Britain. I am happy that the memory of one of the School's finest teachers is permanently kept fresh for us in the founding of the William More Prize for Mathematics in Form VI.

Other individual pupils have starred in special ways : Judith Hanslip won the first prize for Scotland in the Hydro Board's Essay Competition out of 2000 entrants, while Dorothy MacKenzie must be the first D.H.S. pupil to gain the proud privilege of putting letters after her name while still at school — those of A.L.C.M. At very short notice we were asked by the 'Sunday Post' to enter a team for their national weekly Quiz contest. The School team won second place.

While Form VI evaporated very quickly this term in pursuit of temporary jobs (and no doubt equally temporary money) it was very heartening to have a solid core of seniors, especially prefects, remaining true to their obligations. Faithfulness has indeed been the watchword of these cooperative, efficient and happy young people.

After eight months of frustration and hope deferred we have at last taken over six new classrooms in what was Durham's works and shop fronting Constitution Road. This makes the Preparatory Department self-contained and gives much-needed elbow room in the Secondary Department where the national demand for smaller classes, especially in practical subjects, has to be met. The Science Department will from August onwards have the full use of two new labs. The economic squeeze, however, precludes any additions to the Staff.

The standard in all games continues to be high. Though the 1st XV did not reach the high standard of success of immediate past seasons, nevertheless the games were always close and good rugby was played. One forward, Alan Boath, played for the Scottish Districts XV. The standard and enthusiasm lower down the school augur well for the future. On some Saturdays we had as many as 14 teams playing. The Boys' Hockey had an excellent season, the 1st XI losing only two matches. It was possible this season to field seven XI's. Three boys were in the Midlands Schools XI. We had another very good season in Athletics and were undefeated here. Two silver medals were gained in the Scottish Schools' Championships. Our senior tennis team won the Midlands Shield for the fourth successive year. In basketball our team won the Dundee Under-16 Tournament for the first time since 1963.

The Girls' Hockey had a very successful season. Form II team won the Junior Midlands Hockey Tournament. In tennis our 1st VI won the Midlands Schools' Tournament and the Scottish Schools' Tournament — a notable success indeed. In Athletics three girls gained silver medals in the Scottish Schoolgirls' Athletics Championships and Jenny Hogg has been selected for the Scottish Pool of Athletics for the International Matches. At the Dundee Schools Sports our boys won 32 medals and 3 championships out of 4, and our girls 20 medals and 3 championships out of 3 — virtually a clean sweep. A truly remarkable achievement. All of this is evidence that we continue to maintain and better the high standards of past years.

1973 was Tree Planting Year — and we did our bit in the Autumn when the Junior and Preparatory Department children planted trees at both Dalnacraig and Mayfield. They must have been green-fingered for all the trees are flourishing and already have improved the appearance of both fields. We hope to move into Mayfield at the end of the year. The large new pavilion, the excellent playing area, and the groundsman's cottage will all be much valued amenities. There will be general relief at the concentration of work and control now possible and also at the absence of many irritations and worries associated with Monymusk.

Parents and friends continually give us help here in many ways and I would specially record the gift of handsome badges for the Rugby and Girls' Hockey Captains from Mrs Grewar to mark a long family connection with the School and its sport.

In chess the School team has won the 'Sunday Times' Zone 1 Contest out of 27 Scottish teams. Our 1st Year C team won the Dundee and District Division 4 trophy and also that for the District Knock-Out Competition.

The C.C.F. continues to flourish with a record recruitment this year. We have a very good friend here in Colonel Eric Larg. Last year the Larg Trust gifted fine new jackets for the Band. This year, he has enlisted the financial help of several friends and, together with his own gift, over £1000 has been spent on the very best rifles and equipment for the Rifle Club. The Strathcona Shield is now very much in their sights! The Band continues to perform notable public service, including performances in aid of the E.S.U. and the Highland Mod, due in Dundee this autumn. The annual Inspection at Dalnacraig was, for once, blessed with warm sunshine. The high standards of the past were well and truly maintained. In November the annual Remembrance Parade was rounded off by a simple but moving Rededication Service for the 1914-18 War Memorial

now resided in a more dignified setting in the Entrance Hall of the School. We were happy to have Mr K. K. Weatherhead, Hon. President of the Old Boys' Club, to lay the wreath, while the presence of Mr Bain and Mr Erskine, my predecessors in office, was a source of pleasure to all who were present.

The Guides and Brownies (with valuable aid from parents and friends) continue to prosper. The Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme with all its worthwhile associations of initiative, adventure, and hard slog, continues to attract our young folk — two Gold Awards have been earned.

Our relations with the various local authority bodies remain cordial. We welcome for example the Police into the School for Road Safety, Cycling, Career etc. purposes. They have very willingly cooperated in the many difficulties arising from the changes being effected round our island site. I am happy that the Health Authority now has a medical suite of its own in School equipped specially for its staff. This was long overdue. In all our Social Service we work closely with the local Social Work Department. Our Social Service group of pupils — over 30 in number — have continued to do excellent work. Nearly twenty senior citizens have been visited regularly. Over 100 Christmas parcels were distributed. Five different community projects have been run simultaneously — decorating old people's homes, assisting in playgroups, at community centres, helping in a survey of disabled people. I received a letter from one old lady; one sentence said simply : " These young people are a great credit to you and your school." That is reward enough. These young folk are not do-gooders. They quite sincerely care. The Careers Advisory Service experts are very useful and the Child Guidance Staff have been most helpful.

The inauguration of the new traffic system through Albert Square looked likely to cause us difficulties. In the event, it brought together Board, parents, Staff, police and Corporation officials in an effort to solve the problems : this co-operation in itself was valuable. While we deplore the desecration of the beautiful Square, we accept the compromise which is working satisfactorily, subject to human error, and look forward to further benefits from the closing of West Euclid Crescent between the two main buildings.

One further point about the Police. One of the striking trophies on view at Prize-Giving was that won by the School's Public Speaking Team in the national competition organised by the Police of Scotland for the Road Safety Campaign.

The end of session 'prestige' production this year was "Toad of Toad Hall" by L.7 of the Junior Department. This was an ambitious project — fully three hours of dialogue, action and music requiring long months of preparation by eleven-year-old pupils. In the event it was a triumph. Ten months of arduous training and meticulous planning produced four nights of real delight for parents and friends. Thanks to the generous co-operation of parents, and invaluable help from half-a-dozen of the other departments in School, the show was superbly dressed and staged. No praise could be too high for Mr Walter Smith and Miss Lawson who produced the show. The beauty and charm of the original concept was captured with so much skill, imagination and sensitivity that all who saw it were delighted. The educational value of the project is of course incalculable and, in this connection, one feature alone is highly significant — there were two casts — thus enabling all members of L.7 to take some part. Six years ago it was "Tom Sawyer" on film, NOW it is "Toad" that goes into the record-books as a triumph for Mr Smith and his Junior Pupils. The Senior School must look to its laurels now!

The appointment of Dr Douglas Adamson as official Medical Consultant to the School has already proved of inestimable value to me and to the School.

One area where inflation seems to have been kept at bay is the Dining Hall. To have held the price of a three-course lunch at 16p for one year, without lowering the standards one whit, seems to me verging on the miraculous, though that price will have to go up. It has been achieved only by the most meticulous budgeting and strict control of all waste. (Miss Dunbar should be given a Cabinet post straight away!)

I have constantly stressed how high a value I place on the co-operation of parents in the educative process. It is a vital part of the whole business. Again this session they have shown how much they value this by turning out almost 100% to Parents' Evenings in the Preparatory and Junior Departments. The special 'briefing' meetings of L.7 parents, both D.H.S. and of the 30 other schools which 'feed' our Secondary School, have proved very popular. The meetings of Form I and Form V parents have continued. The energy crisis, however, in the Spring term, put paid to our hopes of extending such occasions to other Forms and made this Summer term more than usually hectic.

But the parents and friends proved their loyalty in no uncertain terms when they turned out in their hundreds on the worst evening of the winter for our Christmas Fayre. That was

a resounding success despite the snow. We look forward to the same massive support for a big effort around Easter next year on behalf of the Trust Appeal Fund. I am happy that the Appeal has now topped the £100,000 mark, and that the School now houses the Trust Appeal office.

Pollution is a word much on our lips these days — pollution of the countryside, the air, the sea etc., but not enough is heard about the most dangerous of all forms of this scourge — pollution of the mind and spirit. I have tried today, Sir, to give you a picture of a school, of a community, striving to maintain standards — academic standards, social standards, physical standards, spiritual standards. We do not attempt to shelter behind outmoded traditions. We seek no ivory tower: we do not seek to protect our pupils from the harsh realities of life. There is little merit in virtue that is untested. We are all too vividly aware of the many unspoken assumptions that are undermining so much of our culture today, and seeking to replace it by one that is thoroughly decadent. Everywhere around us values are collapsing. We stick to our principles because they are relevant for that quality of life we are all striving after.

This is the School that a minority of people would seek to destroy — not in the interests of education, and this is the tragedy of it all — but in the pursuit of an outdated, already discredited theory. I am certain that if all concerned — Board, Parents, Staff, Old Boys and Old Girls can stay united and clear in their determination that the School will survive — then survive it will, for survive it must.

The following BURSARIES and SCHOLARSHIPS are within the Patronage of the Directors of the High School of Dundee:—

SCHOOL BURSARIES
